## Becoming a Coordinator

If you are finding that the trips that you like are not being called frequently enough, consider becoming a coordinator!

- New coordinators are required to have a current basic first aid certificate or obtain it during their one year probationary period (partial course subsidies available).
- For those expecting to take activities into avalanche terrain, an avalanche awareness course is required.
- Read this document for information on being a coordinator.
- Fill out an application form, available in either Word or PDF format. Either fill out electronically or print, manually fill in, and scan.

- You must be sponsored by a current Full Coordinator who has been on a few trips with you at the most difficult level that you propose to coordinate. It is helpful if you've been on trips with a variety of other coordinators who can vouch for your abilities.
- The sponsor must write a short statement describing why they're recommending you to become a coordinator.
- Email the completed application form, the sponsor statement, and proof of first aid/AST training to the Trips Director or to <a href="mailto:info@ramblers.ab.ca">info@ramblers.ab.ca</a>.
- The Coordinators' Council will review your application and vote on whether to approve you as a Probationary Coordinator, usually at the spring or fall Council meeting.
